# Reference: NGT order dated 26.11.2019 in OA No. 673/2018 & NGT order dated 21.05.2020 in OA No. 593/2017

- ▶ 163 ULBs to have 243 sewer carrying outlets in Punjab by 30.06.2020.
- NGT has directed that each final outlet of each ULB should have at least in-situ remediation process/ commencement of setting up STP by 30.06.2020 & have functional STPs by 30.06.2021, failing which the concerned departments will be liable to pay compensation @ Rs.5 lakhs/month/drain for in-situ remediation, @ Rs. 5 lakhs/month/STP for default in commencement and @Rs. 10 lakhs/month/STP for default in commissioning of STPs.
- The concerned Departments (mainly Local Govt.) has decided to have 243 STPs and 34 in-situ remediation process in 163 ULBs. The in-situ remediation planned in those ULBs where there is no sewer network and STPs for these ULBs have been taken care of in 243 STPs and may take time.

  - State Coordinator, Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban)
  - State Coordinator, Swachh Bharat Mission (Rural)
  - Officer in charge, Deptt. of Public Relation

- > The meetings of Special Task Force will be convened once in two months
- District Level Task Force to be constituted for million plus cities under Commissioner, MC or DC or DM and for Districts other than million plus cities, under DM.

#### **Action Desired**

- The State may constitute Special Task Force under Chief Secretary, Punjab as suggested by MoEF, GOI.
- The District Environment Committees already constituted under the respective DCs to monitor the implementation of Water, Air & SWMs Action Plans may be given the responsibility to monitor the elimination of SUP and implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016.
- The Action Plan already prepared for the Management of Plastic Waste, in compliance of NGT orders, may be submitted to Deptt. of Local Govt. and Deptt. of Rural Development and Panchayats to verify the existing data and to make the necessary changes in the Action Plan for elimination of single use plastic and implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016.

- The work for carrying capacity and source apportionment studies is likely to be completed by 30.06.21.
- PPCB developed android based mobile application for receiving public complaints which is to be made functional by 30.04.21.
- The Agency for Noise Mapping is to be hired by 30.05.21 & mapping to be completed by 30.09.21. Thereafter, the specifications of noise limiters to be conveyed to DLG for implementation.

> Air Pollution Control in Major Industrial Towns

#### Progress

- 113 induction furnaces out of 118 converted to Side Suction Hood to control air pollution in Mandi Gobindgarh (MGG), Khanna & Ludhiana by 31.03.21.
- 50 rolling mills in MGG converted from Coal to CNG/PNG out of total 683 in MGG, Khanna, Ludhiana and Amritsar. The work of CNG pipeline in Khanna & Ludhiana yet to be started.
- > 54 brick kilns out of 64 converted from natural draft to induced draft.
